PASTOR'S DESK

Theologians often refer to the Christian church as "Easter People", a shorthand way of saying that the church exists as a result of the events of Easter and that Christians live in an "Easter manner". That the church was birthed by Easter is a given. That Christians live in an "Easter manner" may or may not be true.

What is an "Easter manner"? What behaviors and attitudes define us as Easter people? St. Paul spends significant portions of his letters contrasting the "old person (old self)" with the "new person (new self)", the person of the flesh with the person of the Spirit. The behavior and being of the person of the flesh is determined, if not at least influenced, by the impact of the things of this world, the culture in which we live, the impulses which motivate our behavior. The desire to "keep up with the Joneses" is the old person. The tendency to deal with people in stereotypes rather than as unique children of God and, therefore, brothers and sisters, is a manifestation of our "old self". By contrast, the "new person (new self)" is guided by the ministry of Jesus, by a living out of our status as loved children of God. When living out of the "new self", we act as people who are blessed by God to be a blessing to the world.

Now it seems to me that this life-style contrast between old and new self is a hard row to hoe. Even when we mean well and work at living in a just, loving, and gentle manner, we keep being tripped up by our innate human tendencies. No sooner do we perform some act of kindness toward another then we become impatient and angry about someone's actions toward us. That is why it is important to be part of a Christian community. When the church is being the church, we support one another and hold one another accountable to the gifts of grace and faith. If I am not being kind to others, I hope someone will call to my attention my insensitivity. If you are being narrow in your acceptance of others, I hope someone in the community reminds you that we are to act "like Jesus" in dealing with others. When we suffer, I hope there are people there to lean on, people who carry you through difficulties when you have little strength left in you.

That is what it means to be "Easter people". I hope Trinity is filled with "Easter people". Are you one of them?
