## Pastor's Corner

### "Gifts Given, Gifts Received"

According to St. Paul, our Lord Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35). I am sure you have experienced the blessing Jesus is referring to - the blessing you realize as you give a gift to another person. Remember, for instance, that special gift you bought for your lover. It cost more money than you expected to spend, but you knew how deeply he or she would rejoice in receiving it. So you bought it, and even as you made the monetary transaction, you began to rejoice inside, anticipating your lover's delight in the gift. That's a blessing.

Likewise, you can remember being the recipient of a very special gift. And likewise, you have felt that joy well up inside you when your lover presented you with the gift. The gift was a blessing - but the deeper blessing was what the gift represented - the love that someone had for you.

Gifts given, gifts received, are not for lovers only. Gifts signify and bring joy to us as kids, parents, friends and neighbors - and even, I am happy to say, as pastors and parishioners. Before I became a pastor, I never expected that this blessing of giving and receiving would take place in ministry. But it does, and receiving gifts as a pastor does the same for me as receiving gifts as a father, husband, friend or neighbor.

Let me explain. For the first seven years of my ministry as a pastor, there were not many gifts to go around. I struggled in my first congregation. There was division and suspicion, and I didn't seem to be able to make any helpful changes in that place. It seemed there were very few gifts being given or received there. I remember coming home from church on many Christmas Eves tired and depressed, and just glad that the service was over and I was home.

What a surprise it was on Christmas Eve at my second call. When the church service was over and I was taking my robes off, the president of the congregation came into my office and handed me an envelope. In it was a Christmas card and several hundreds of dollars. Unbeknownst to me the congregation had taken up a special offering and presented it to me as a Christmas present. I know Jesus says it is more blessed to give - but let me tell you - it was a wonderful blessing to receive such a generous surprise that evening. Vickie and I had little kids at home, and like any young family, we put that gift to use very quickly. But the deeper

blessing of course was what the card and hundreds of dollars signified; wonderful people cared about us and received us into their fellowship. And they wanted us to know they loved us, so they did for us what they did for the other people they loved - they gave us a special gift.

Not all congregations do this. I have served four congregations as pastor. Three of the four have let me know of their love for me every Christmas by these special gifts. I want to say thank you - not only for the gift Trinity's president Chip Rockwell gave me on your behalf at Christmas this year, but for what it means to me and Vickie. Thank you for receiving me and my family into your midst. Thank you for your love. I know our time together is temporary, and that is the way it should be, but I want you to know that I enjoy ministering to you and I love and care for you too. I was blessed to receive your gift. I hope and pray that you will be blessed in my time with you.

The steering committee for the Micah's Backpack program countywide is looking for ways to help the 465 transitional/homeless students in this county. (Statistics provided by the Board of Education as of 11-14-16.) They are classified as transitional because they have no permanent residence. Of those 465 students, 226 are Elementary school age and are presumably being taken care of by the current Micah's Backpack program. The remaining 239 middle and high school students are not currently being assisted. In talking with Kathy Powderly from the steering committee, she revealed that these students are homeless for a variety of reasons including abusive / dysfunctional home lives.

After learning of these statistics at our last Micah's community meeting, we inquired about how many of these students were at Boonsboro Middle and High school and learned that there were a total of 15 at both schools. We expressed an interest in helping them and was told that they were working on a program. At a more recent Micah's steering committee meeting they decided that they would like to start a pilot program at the schools with the most need. Those schools are South Hagerstown High School with 51 students and E. Russell Hicks Middle School with 20 students. We were asked to participate in that pilot program.

Beginning February 1st, we will be packing 20 bags for delivery to E. Russell Hicks. A small pantry has been established in the area behind and to the left of the stage area. Packing will be done on Wednesday evenings in the social room by various youth groups, including Trinity's.

Jerry and Cathy Landsman have graciously agreed to deliver the bags after delivering 13 bags to Rockland Woods Elementary. Thanks Jerry and Cathy! Thanks to all the youth groups who have enthusiastically embraced this project. Thanks to all of the members of Trinity for your continued support of this ministry.

If you would like to make food donations, we could use jars of peanut butter, 15 oz cans of any pasta, and canned vegetables. Cans with pop-tops are preferable when available. Please leave donations either in the kitchen or on the food pantry cart beside our freezer off the social room, as we keep track of all donations to the Micah's Backpack program.
