I always place it front and center on the table in our living room, close to the Christmas tree. This poem serves as a reminder of the true meaning of Christmas. Christmas is our yearly celebration of God's fully entering into his world, taking on our lives and flesh to go about reclaiming the world from the powers of darkness which threaten to overcome it. While culturally Christmas Day may be the climatic finale to a month of preparation for a wonderful family time, for Christians this day is another opportunity to immerse ourselves in the good news of God's never-failing love, to rededicate ourselves to growing spiritually and to discipleship, to living our lives as "little Christs", to use Martin Luther's terminology. After the wonderful day (and week that follows) of gift giving, parties, and holiday cheer, Christians roll up our sleeves and get to work addressing the issues in the forefront of God's mind; the spiritual and physical welfare of his children. For the true meaning of Christmas is that God acted in a decisive way to draw us to himself in this life and in the next.

When the song of the angels is stilled,  
When the star in the sky is gone,  
When the kings and princes are home,

    To heal the broken,  
    To feed the hungry,  
    To release the prisoner,  
    To rebuild the nations,  
    To bring peace among all,  
    To make music in the heart.

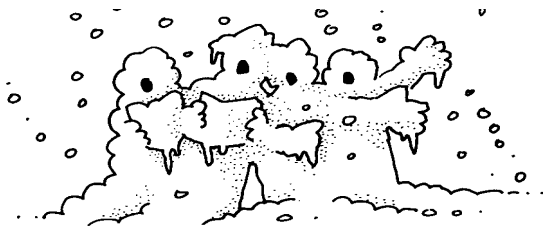

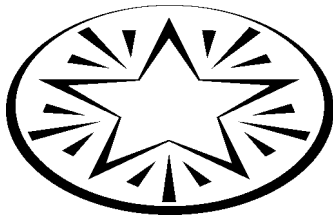

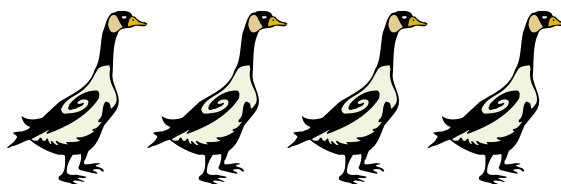


**JANUARY FIRST FRIDAY IS COMING QUICKLY!**

Yes, we bring our dog to church. His name is Boomer and he is in training to be a service dog. He is a mixture of a yellow Labrador and a Golden Retriever. His forehead frequently wrinkles when he is waiting for a command or his ball.

The state correctional institutions here in Boonsboro are home to America's VetDogs Prison Puppy Programs. In this special program, inmates are raising and training puppies who will one day work as service dogs for wounded veterans. In many facilities, incarcerated veterans are participating in the program giving them an emotional connection to their dog's future handler and partner.

Each weekend, puppies go home with a volunteer. These "weekend puppy raisers" teach house manners, socialize them to car rides, traffic noise and visit stores, restaurants, churches and hospitals so that they will be confident wherever their future veteran partner will go. That is where we come in. We have had Boomer every weekend since August of 2015 and recently began to occasionally bring him to church service. Volunteering in this program gives us the opportunity to combine our love for dogs and our ongoing respect for the United States Military.

So please don't be shocked if you see a tail sticking out from the pew.

## December Council Minutes

### FINANCIAL REPORTS

The Financial Secretary's Report was sent via email and reviewed by Council. We continue to be short of our budgeted amount, but are hopeful that this

will be resolved by the end of December.

John Talley provided a written copy of the Treasurer's Report. The balance in Benevolence is now \$992.75, but he still needs to pay \$1,500 (Apportionment, Ambulance and Fire). If we do not receive sufficient donations, John is asking for permission to transfer \$1,000 from the Building Fund. Karen made a motion to approve this transfer of funds; Susan seconded; all voted in favor.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Tim provided a verbal report for the Property Committee. They have decided to do the landscaping in the front of the church and parsonage themselves, in the spring. Tuba Greenfield will assist with the design. They also had a discussion about security in the Church. We recently lost two air conditioning units (not certain if they are misplaced or have been taken). They are suggesting changing the security code periodically and only giving it to certain individuals who need it. Tom suggested a security system with individual access codes, so that there is a record of who has been in the building. He will get information and pricing. Gene commended the Property Committee for the new Wi-Fi set up.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

Everyone agreed that the presentation on giving at the Congregational Meeting went well and that we should continue to make that information available to everyone. Gene agreed to do his presentation on December 20, prior to the worship service (10:10 a.m.).

We also agreed to revisit the issue of electronic giving. Since there is a cost to this (\$0.25 per transaction), we should consider having only a monthly, rather than weekly, transaction.

Pastor Joe spoke to Mark Poffenberger about re-establishing the Stewardship Committee. They are going to consider candidates for this Committee and he will have information for the January Council meeting.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Chip had a prior discussion with Pastor Joe about Benevolence and determined that the Council needs to define a process for selecting and promoting specific activities/organizations whom we want to support. Gene suggested that we have a specific committee (either a new committee or an established committee) be responsible for this. Their first task would be to establish a policy and criteria for donations. No firm decision was made.

Dale Ford submitted a request for 2015 Benevolence funding for Johnie and Friends and for Gideons. Karen made a motion to approve \$250 for each from 2015 funding, coming from the Witness/Evangelism line item in the budget. John seconded the motion and it passed by majority vote.

Jen Poffenberger asked if Funk funding could be used for Road Trip for youth group members (6 youth and 2 adults, \$100 each for the deposit needed at this time). Theresa made a motion to approve; Zane seconded; all voted in favor.

Pastor Joe reported that a Drug Intervention Program will be held at Trinity tomorrow night. An issue that was raised in prior meetings was the need for Family Support Group meetings. He asked for permission to allow these meetings at Trinity and this was approved.
