## Pastor's Corner

### Lent, 2017

*"Savior, when in dust to you, low we bow in homage due; when, repentant, to the skies scarce we lift our weeping eyes; oh, by all your pains and woe suffered once for us below, bending from your throne on high, hear our penitential cry!"*

Easter comes late this year (April 16, as compared to March 27 last year). Which means that Lent comes late this year (March 1, as compared to February 10 last year)

Late is better. It has given us time to put all those Advent preparations and Christmas festivities behind us. When Lent comes early, our bodies and spirits are still recuperating from the energies we expended in relation to the Christmas holiday (example – how many of us get sick or feel tired after Christmas?). But when Lent comes late, we have had more Epiphany time to ponder with Mary and the wise men some of the deeper meanings of Christ's arrival to our world. And we have started to feel a little more deeply than usual our need for God.

When Lent arrives late, we can appreciate it more for another reason. One of the meanings of Lent is "lengthening of days". We have all noticed the increased hours of sunlight as we mark the length of winter. And the increased sunlight we have witnessed only makes us long for more. That is so much of what Lent is about – yearning, longing, waiting for new birth. We celebrate that new birth on Easter, the Resurrection of our Lord.

A few months ago we reminded ourselves that "Jesus is the reason for the season". Lent however, says to us that "We are the reason for the season". This time of transition, from darkness to light, from cold to warm, is not without its difficulties and dangers. We have had extra time this year to think about our frailties, to feel our brokenness, to sense our need for God's forgiveness and transforming power. That is why I say that we are the reason for this season. Lent came into being as a response to our longing for God, and our longing for nothing less than God.

Wednesday, March 1 is Ash Wednesday. We will hold worship that evening at 7:00. We will offer the imposition of ashes – the rite in which we acknowledge death, brokenness, and powerlessness. We will confess our sins. We will hear the Word, meant to expand and give hope to our hearts. We will commune at the table of our Lord, being assured by God himself that he has taken our sin, our death and brokenness and defeated them by his power and love. And we will prepare our hearts and lives for Easter.

## Consecration Sunday Is Coming March 26

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

*New Consecration Sunday* is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, March 26, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* (which will be handed out that day) does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and Church Council members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday events.
